



Certificate Program (NEW)

The Center for Law Enforcement Education and Mount Aloysius College offer certification in the field of accident reconstruction.

The Professional Certificate in Judicial Development is an innovative program designed for law-enforcement officers or individuals in the private sector who wish to concentrate their studies within a focused academic arena.

The certification covers the topics and specialties involved in accident reconstruction and complements pre-existing education and training in the discipline. Students who earn certificates will achieve a higher level of reconstruction expertise, skills, and knowledge.

Certificate Program FAQ

How do I enroll in the Certificate Program of my choice?

To enroll in the Certificate Program, please call the CLEE Office at (866) 336-7722 or via email rvarner@centerforlawenforcementeducation.com. You must have completed at least one course prior to enrolling in the certificate program. You will be notified by the CLEE registrar of your acceptance into the program.

Can courses qualify in more than one area of certification simultaneously?

Yes. However, the same course cannot be used for more than two areas of certification.

For example, courses in the General Accident Reconstruction program would count towards that certificate and, so long as they fit with the required and/or elective options for the coursework, also be eligible as credit within the Commercial Motor Vehicle program. However, that same credit could not also then be applied to the Conspicuity - Human Factors Program.



Will I be given credit for those courses that I have already taken (retroactive credit)?

From the time at which you are accepted into the certificate program, you will be given credit for a maximum of two qualifying courses listed in your certificate choice, dating back five years. If you enter the program in 2015, for instance, you will be able to count towards your certificate two courses (for a maximum of 10 retroactive credit hours) taken between 2010 and 2015.

Will the CLEE accept transfer credits?

No. Due to the distinctiveness of the CLEE's judicial education environment, we do not accept transfer credits from other judicial education institutions.

Are there additional fees for the Certificate Program?

Yes. CLEE has a \$25 enrollment fee. This fee will go towards the monitoring and documentation of all your CLEE training courses. The only other CLEE fees incurred are the tuition fees charged for enrollment in all CLEE courses.

What do I receive upon completion of the Certificate Program?

Upon completion of the program, you will receive a certificate in the accident reconstruction discipline(s) development course(s) that you enrolled in from the Center for Law Enforcement Education - Mount Aloysius College. This certificate will be awarded at graduation upon completion of the final course required for certification.
